Mask Recommended but Optional starting Monday, March 7th

The school board met last night, Tuesday March 1, to discuss a transition to the new Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations for face masks in schools.

The updated guidance applies to schools, as well as other environments. A link to the details of this guidance can be found here. In short, the CDC uses selected metrics to assign a "COVID-19 Community Level" by state and county. These levels include "low, medium, and high." The North Shore Health Department will be providing schools this data each Friday.

Supporting Everyones Personal Choice

As a district our goal is for all of our families to feel supported, respected and understood. A family and student's decision on whether or not to wear a mask is personal and should be free of judgement of any kind. We will work hard as a staff to ensure that your students feel supported in their choice.

Support for this Transition

We are working to pull together resources that staff will use when having conversations with students in preparation for Monday. Our school social worker and SST team will also be available to talk with any students who need additional supports.

We understand that we all have different feelings around this from anxiety to joy and our students will be no different. Staff are prepared to have thoughtful conversations with students to support this transition.

District Covid-19 Communication

Data will continue to be updated on the district dashboard.

Communication will be sent regarding positive cases reported.

Should your classroom have a positive case you will be notified of the need to wear masks for 10 days.

Emails on case numbers will NO LONGER be sent on days when we have no reported cases.

When should we still wear a mask?

As stated by the CDC in their latest guidance, "...people who wear high quality masks are well protected, even if others around you are not masking. And there are some situations where people should always wear a mask."

Isolation protocols are still in place. If someone tests positive for COVID-19, they should stay home for at least 5 days and wear a well-fitting mask for an additional 5 days.

Should a student test positive and come into contact with other students at school, we will **require** masking for that classroom and for the close contacts for a time period of 10 days.

We strongly recommend symptomatic students wear a mask



Possible Transition Back to Masking

The district will notify families if/when we would need to go back to a universal masking mitigation protocol in one of our buildings. This will only occur if **3% or higher (staff and students combined)** are identified as covid positive. This data will be monitored on Friday's and communicated to families. The transition would be for **two weeks** or until the percent of cases is below 3%.

The district will also notify families if our county/community data as reported to us by the North Shore Health reaches a **High** level indicating a need to transition back to universal masking.

Continued Mitigations

NOVIR testing on-site available for daily testing and weekly screening
Contact tracing
Social distancing when possible
Increased disinfecting
Hand washing and hand sanitizing
Encouraging families to keep students home if they are sick

If a person in your household tests positive for COVID-19, we ask that you contact the district nurse (414/507-2459) to discuss proper isolation/quarantine precautions to effectively protect your family and our school community.






